



North Electric Trail

The North Electric Trail

The North Electric Trail stretches 1.9 miles between NRH₂O and Holiday Lane along the North Texas Utilities easement. At its completion in 1999, the North Electric trail became the first multi-use trail in the City of North Richland Hills. In an agreement with the State of Texas, through the Texas Department of Transportation, and the City of North Richland Hills, this project was made possible by the Statewide Transportation Enhancement Program ("STEP") as part of the Intermodal Surface Transportation Efficiency Act of 1991 ("ISTEA").
