

NOTICE OF POSTPONED SPECIAL ELECTION

To the registered voters of the City of North Richland Hills, Texas:

TAKE NOTICE that a special election to be held in the City of North Richland Hills, Texas on May 2, 2020, concerning the issuance of general obligation bonds in the aggregate principal amount of not more than \$49,875,000 for streets, roads, sidewalks, trails and related utility and drainage improvements, the acquisition of real property necessary or incidental for such purposes and the levying of taxes sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds will be imposed; **has been postponed to November 3, 2020.**

The City Council of the City of North Richland Hills, Texas at their March 23, 2020 meeting approved Resolution No. 2020-015, to postpone the May 2, 2020 Special Election to the next uniform election date occurring on November 3, 2020, pursuant to gubernatorial proclamation dated March 18, 2020, as amended. The special election is to consider the following proposition:

PROPOSITION A

Shall the City Council of the City of North Richland Hills, Texas be authorized to issue and sell one or more series of general obligation bonds of the City in the aggregate principal amount of not more than \$49,875,000 for the purpose of designing, acquiring, constructing, renovating, improving, upgrading, updating, and equipping City streets, roads, and intersections, and related curb, gutter, sidewalk, trail, drainage and utility infrastructure improvements, demolition, repair, and rebuilding of existing streets, completing necessary or incidental utility relocation and drainage in connection with the foregoing and the acquisition of land, easements, rights-of-way, and other real property interests necessary therefor or incidental thereto, such bonds to mature serially or otherwise (not more than 40 years from their date) in accordance with law; and any issue or series of such bonds to bear interest at such rate or rates (fixed, floating, variable or otherwise) as may be determined within the discretion of the City Council, provided that such rate of interest shall not exceed the maximum rate per annum authorized by law at the time of the issuance of any issue or series of such bonds; and shall the City Council of the City be authorized to levy and pledge, and cause to be assessed and collected, annual ad valorem taxes, within the limitations prescribed by law, on all taxable property in the City sufficient to pay the annual interest and provide a sinking fund to pay the bonds at maturity and the cost of any credit agreements executed in connection with the bonds?

On Election Day, the City shall be divided into election precincts and the polling places designated for each election precinct shall be designated by Tarrant County.

[Tarrant County participates in the Countywide Polling Place program under Section 43.007 of the Texas Election Code. Registered voters will be able to cast their Election Day ballots at any of the Vote Centers identified above or on the County's website: www.tarrantcounty.com/en/elections]

The relevant dates for the November 3, 2020 election are as follows:

- October 5, 2020 – voter registration deadline
- October 23, 2020 – deadline to submit an application for ballot by mail
- October 19, 2020 – October 30, 2020 – early voting by personal appearance

Applications for ballot by mail (ABBMs) for voters that are voting by mail due to being over the age of 65 or due to disability will still be valid for the postponed election. ABBMs for voters who submitted applications based on expected absence from the county are not valid for the postponed election.

Applications for voting by mail should be received no later than the close of business (5:00 p.m.) on October 23, 2020. Applications should be sent to:

If an application for ballot by mail is faxed or emailed (or if a federal postcard application is faxed), the applicant must also mail the original application so that the early voting clerk receives the original no later than four business days after receiving the emailed or faxed copy.
